
SUBJECT: Papers that will be Processed by the Radio Control Office

Pursuant to Letter of Instruction No. 13-A of the President of the Philippines dated September 29, 1972, it is hereby announced that effective immediately and until further notice, only the following applications will be considered for processing by the Radio Control Office, in addition to those authorized in Memorandum Circular No. 4 dated September 25, 1972:

1. Renewal of existing Radio Station and Operator Licenses.
2. Renewal of Certificates of Recognition and Station Licenses of Radio Training Schools.
3. Issuance of licenses for amateur stations with previously approved construction permits on the authorized amateur bands only.
4. Modification of station licenses, except for stations in the types of services which are either banned or suspended, for change of:
  - a. transfer of location
  - b. hours of operation
  - c. points of communications
  - d. license status of amateur radio stations from Class "B" to Class "A" or from Class "C" to Class "B"

No construction permit shall be required for the modification of an existing station license without substantial change of its characteristics and provided that no interference will be caused to other existing stations.

5. Modification of station licenses, except for stations in the types of service which are either banned or suspended, with approved construction permits for:
  - a. change of transmitters/transceivers of existing stations
  - b. additional transmitters/transceivers of existing stations
  - c. change of types of emission
  - d. increase of power for coastal stations
6. Applications for permit to purchase, possess and own radio transmitters and transceivers.
7. Renewal of existing dealer's/manufacturer's permits, all subject to inspection before permits are issued.
8. Issuance of licenses for new stations with previously approved construction permits, subject however to inspection before the issuance of licenses.
